Tour Championship Presented by Polo Golf

The Fox Club

November 11-12

R.J. Nakashian of Palm Beach Gardens and Pete Williams of Juno Beach each won his age group Saturday in the second annual Polo Golf Tour Championship staged by the Palm Beach County Golf Association at The Fox Club.

Nakashian, 44, shot 73-72-145 to win the regular division by a stroke

over Mike Weeks of Jupiter, the first round leader who closed with 76-146. It was R.J.'s 14th PBCGA title since 2004, his fourth this year. "I am very surprised. I just sort of hung in there, kept playing, trying not to make any big mistakes today." Nakashian said. "I think I was seven strokes behind after 13 holes yesterday."

By comparison, Williams, 51, shot 70-73-143 to win the senior division by five. He led by three after the first round. "I made a triple bogey on the second hole today," he said, "but I kept thinking about Keegan Bradley" of Jupiter, who made a triple bogey on the 15th hole of the final round at the PGA Championship in August but came back to win in a playoff.

The victory also secured the Bankrate Cup Title for Nakashian and the Braman Cup Title for Williams. The Bankrate and Braman Cup award is for the year long points standings.

Tim Cox of Palm Beach Gardens and Scott Blasie of Lake Worth were the winners Sunday in the 26th annual Palm Beach County Senior Four-Ball Championship at Hammock Creek Golf Club.

A final round of eight under par 64, four-ball stroke play, which included four birdies by each player, led to a 36-hole score of 126 and victory by two strokes. They opened Friday with a scramble score of 62 to trail by two. The middle round Saturday, modified alternate shots, was rained out.

It was the second win for Cox and Blaise as teammates. Last year, they combined to capture the senior division of the Arrigo Fiat Classic at Mayacoo Lakes. Overall, Cox has 12 Palm Beach County Golf Association titles, Blaise three.

In the super seniors flight for PBCGA members 65 and older, Don Edwards of Hobe Sound and Paul Quigley of Jupiter won for the second time this year, scoring 64-67-131 to win by six. In April they topped the Senior Better Ball at the nearby Fox Club.

Senior Amateur Old Trail-Fazio October 1-2

Pete Williams of Juno Beach, the Palm Beach County Golf Association Senior Player of the Year in 2010, is back on track in pursuit of similar honors this year. Williams won for the first time this season when he captured the 32nd annual Senior Amateur Championship on the Fazio course at Jonathan's Landing Golf Club at Old Trail, winning Sunday by seven strokes with 68-70-138.

Williams, 52, a pilot for United Airlines, won four titles a year ago. So far this season, he has been runnerup three times - the Mid-Amateur match play, the International, a Stableford event, and the Spring Four-Ball with David Abell, losing out on the second playoff hole.

"I only had one bogey in 36 holes here," Williams said. "I guess some of the things I've been working on with (teaching pro) Bob Below at Lone Pine are starting to kick in." Williams had three birdies Sunday, all on putts in the 12-17 foot range, at Nos. 7, 10 and 14. He bogeyed the par-4 17th after missing the green. He made four birdies in a bogey-free round Saturday.

Tim Conboy of Lantana, tied for second after the first round, finished second for the weekend on 69-76-145.

Bob Stieren of Palm Beach Gardens won the super seniors flight for players 65 and older with 78-74-152. He pulled away from Aldo Butera of Boynton Beach with birdies at the 13th and 14th holes, his 16th and 17th of the day after starting at No.16. Butera was second at 79-77-156.

Net winners were David Merrell, Palm Beach Gardens, ages 50-64, with 70-68-138, and Butera, 65-older, 65-63-128.
